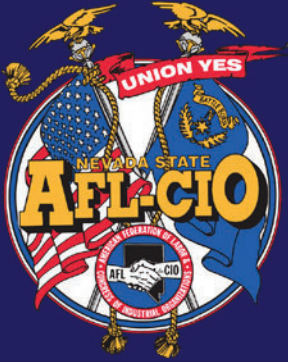

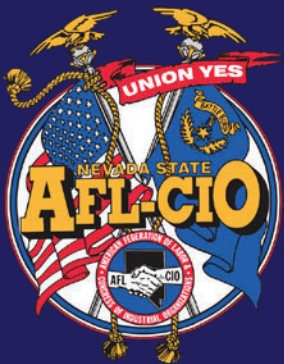

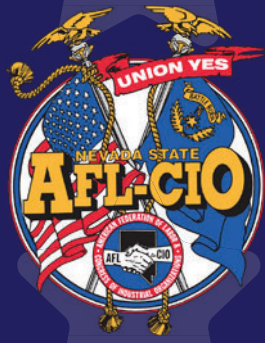

# INTRODUCTION

This Labor Legislative Scorecard shows where your state legislators stood on important issues that impact the labor movement and the overall wellbeing of Nevada's working families.

The Nevada State AFL-CIO Executive Board came to a consensus to include the voting records for 10 labor-supported bills that were voted on in the 82nd legislative session.

The scores are calculated based on each legislator's vote on individual legislation that the Nevada State AFL-CIO supports.

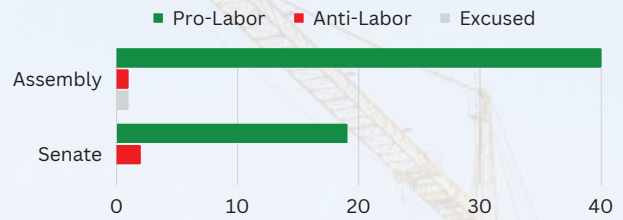

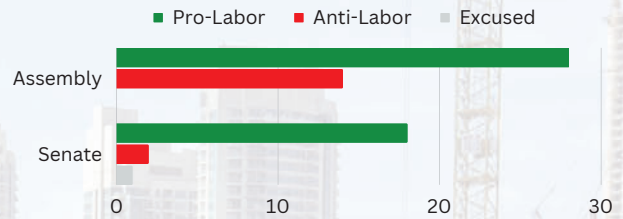


## AB214

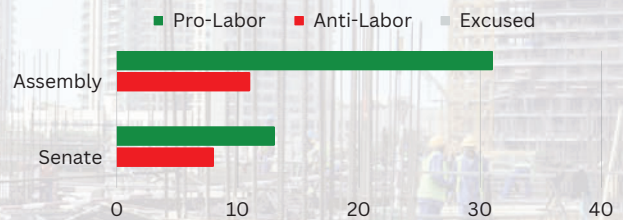


## AB224

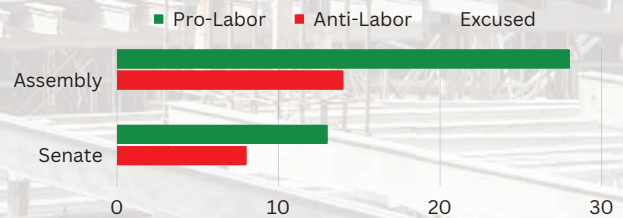


## AB456

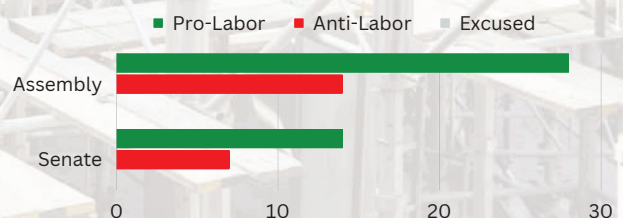


## AB522

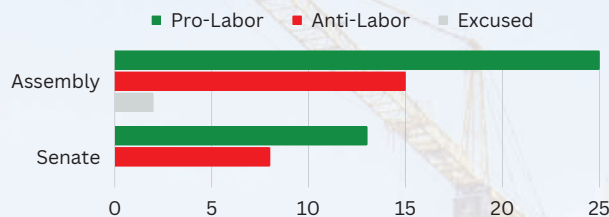
# SCORECARD LEGISLATION

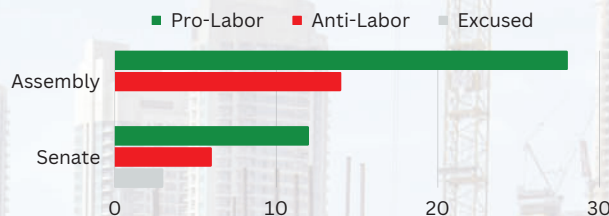


## SB226

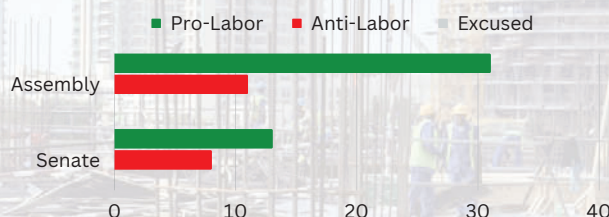


## SB314

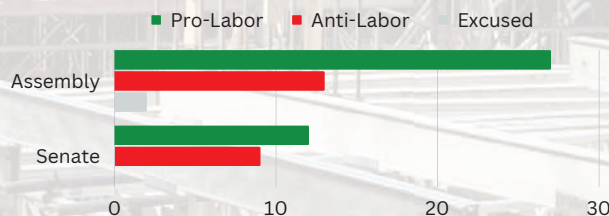


## SB371

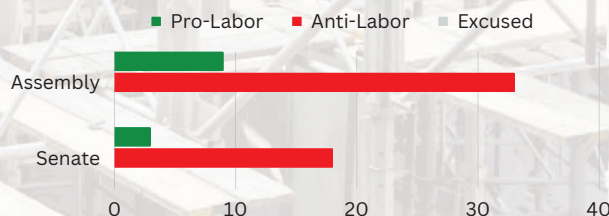


## SB441

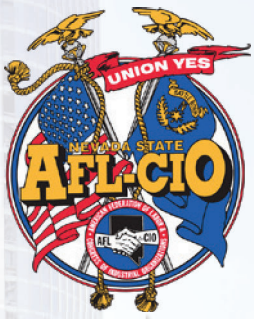

*\*The list below consists of anti-labor legislation that wasn't included on the Labor Legislative Scorecard, but we believe is still important for members to be aware of.*

## AB108

This bill, introduced by **Assemblywoman Sandra Jauregui (D, AD-41)**, proposed that Nevada join the Nurse Licensure Compact, which would have hurt our local nurses by forcing the state to adhere to rules set by national administrators and threaten their wages and opportunities.

**LABOR OPPOSED.**  
**DIED IN COMMITTEE.**

## AB460

This bill, put forward by the Office of the Governor, would exempt agencies providing nursing services to medical facilities from the requirement to be licensed as a nursing pool, thus creating "gig" nursing platforms that would endanger the health of patients.

**LABOR OPPOSED.**  
**PASSED ASSEMBLY 37-5. DIED IN SENATE COMMITTEE.**

## SB108

This bill, introduced by **Senator Rochelle Nguyen (D, SD-3)**, would dismantle the three-tiered system that separates producers, distributors, and retailers in beer distribution and lead to a painful loss of jobs within the industry.
